<p>Say kind words.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">*Ask for help respectfully and clearly. ("Can you show me ten frames again please?")*Use words that help others. ("Do you want me to try to show you how I did it?")*Use words that are just right for your work. ("I predicted it would float.")*Use words that are just right for your feelings. ("That sounds confusing to me.")
<p>Make safe choices.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">*Walk in the classroom.*Take a calming breath or movement break.*Use materials as they are supposed to be used.*Transition to groups safely and then give everyone their personal space.
<p>Always be responsible.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">*Share your materials.*Keep work in your desk, work bin or work folder.*Keep your own materials in your own cubby or desk.*Keep your desk and work folder organized.
<p>Respect your school.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">*Eyes and ears on the speaker without interrupting in whole and small groups.*Watch and listen to how others learn and let that help you, too.*Take care of, organize and put materials away to keep the classroom neat.*When a teacher is working alone with another student, be patient and wait your turn.
<p>Try your best.</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">*When you are working alone, set a goal for yourself so you don't quit or give up.*Give yourself a pep talk or write a peppy note. ("I can do this!")*Double check your work for directions and to check that your answers make sense.*Stop and think about what you already know and then try it again.
