*Class updates:

Freshmen (Pres. Jenna Dorr) – Breakfast with Santa was a big success. Raised \$1k! Also included Boston Children's Hospital "Mia's Toy Drive" donation drop off. This will become an annual event for the class of 2021. The freshmen class will host the concession stand on 2/6 at the Varsity Girls' Basketball game. If more than 20 tuxes are ordered they will also deliver & pick up rentals at WHS. Otherwise patrons must come into the store (Revere Beach Parkway - Chelsea) to get/return the tuxedos. They are also offering discounts on prom dresses to WHS students. Prom tickets will be sold 4/2-4/13 during school lunches. Cost TBD. Prom dates outside of WHS must have their school administration sign a permission slip as well as sign a code of conduct agreement. The Class of 2018 will be hosting a Talent Show on 3/15. Sign ups are now through 3/1 and are open to all WHS students (and staff), mandatory rehearsal will be on 3/13. Raffles and concession stand will be set up on the show date. The proceeds will be used to help fund the Overnight Party. The 11 Foundation graciously donated \$1500 toward the Senior Overnight Party. *Guidance report (Kathleen D'Amico) – GPA's will be run on first semester grades next week and available on Ipass the following week under Biography. Top 10% letters go out mid-April. Guidance will be going into the ELA classes from 2/5-2/16 to go over next year's course selections with students. Parents will be able to view/approve their child's classes from 2/19-3/2. Teacher recommendation is required for AP courses. Scholarship applications will be available on-line from 3/1 and are due 4/15 unless otherwise noted.
