Please be sure your child is in school and on time each day!

Prior to the end of the school year, teachers will complete and submit a very comprehensive student placement grid which will summarize the academic status of students, specifics about their approach to learning, general academic profile and student learning history. This placement grid is an especially useful tool as we work to create classrooms that factor in the unique academic and emotional needs of our students.

Experience tells us that these final two months of school pass faster than any others which means summer will be here before we know it. Whatever your child does, it is imperative that it include an opportunity for social skill building and academic reinforcement. One option worth considering may be Camp Fort, a school based program for incoming kindergarten through grade 2 students. The program runs 8:30-12:30 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from July 10th through August 16th. Tuition for Camp Fort is \$360. This program is popular and fills up quickly. Registration forms are available in our school's office or for more information and to register your child, come to our Registration Night on May 31st from 6:30-7:30 p.m. in the school's multi-purpose room.

These months will also find students enjoying an array of extra-curricular programs and a nice assortment of activities specific to grade level. A check of our calendar shows you that although the year is coming to a close full and active participation by our students in class and by families at home remains critically important.
