PUBLIC COMMENT

- Vasilli Mallios, 90 Pleasant Street, spoke about the lack of senior teachers. We hire them, we train them and then they leave. There are budgetary uncertainties every year. Tough decisions to live here and teach here.
- MaryAlice Sharkey, 4 Paine Street, past school committee member and past WTA President. She supports the WTA. Please give our members at least the bare minimum that was in the last contract. Mrs. Sharkey shared some salary levels throughout the district.
- Kristen Reynolds, 100 Johnson Avenue, WTA President, encourages the school committee to settle the current contract. Mrs. Reynolds provided committee with a copy of the current salary schedule. We are not able to retain our teachers with this large salary gap. The WTA is ready to settle.
- Patricia Cuddy, 69 Bellevue Avenue, spoke about a course she took regarding teaching strategies. Teaching experience is so important and significant for the students they teach. Students learn more and are more likely to do better in other measures of success.
- Mary Gail Clucas, 87 Marshall Street, spoke regarding the social and emotional needs of students. It is frightening to see kindergarteners coming to school with emotional needs. We need adjustment counselors and help.

The School Department is currently charging less for school breakfast and lunch than wat is mandated by the Department of Elementary & Secondary Education (DESE). Due to the increase from DESE and wage increases, the following increases are recommended:

FY 20 Middle School & High School \$3.25 per lunch William P. Gorman & Arthur T. Cummings School \$3.00 per lunch Breakfast for all schools \$1.75 Adults \$4.00 per lunch

FY21

Middle & High School \$3.50 per lunch William P. Gorman & Arthur T. Cummings School \$3.25 per lunch Breakfast for all schools \$2.00 Adults \$4.25 per lunch
