WHS Handbook Highlights:

The school handbook is found on the school website, https://www.winthrop.k12.ma.us/Page/3058 Some key parts of the handbook are:

•Cell Phones: Students are NOT allowed to use cell phones during class time at Winthrop High School. Any student found using a cell phone during class time, will be subject to school discipline. Students are permitted to use electronic devices during their

assigned lunch period as well as during transition time between class periods. Use of electronic devices during non-permitted times will result in the following consequences: Cell phone will be taken away by administrator; Parent will be called to pick up the phone; Administrative detention; Suspension.

•Make-up Work: Students must accept the responsibility of all make-up work caused by absences. Teachers will provide students with one (1) day per day of absence from school unless there are extenuating circumstances. Students must complete work missed as a result of any absence (excused or unexcused) in the required time of one (1) days per day of absences. (Arrangements must be made with individual teachers.)
•Plagiarism: Any student who cheats/plagiarizes on an examination, or any other assignment, shall receive a zero, and may not make-up such work. The instructor, who will then notify the parent/guardian, will privately admonish the student. Any use of artificial intelligence (ie. Snapchat AI, CHATGPT, etc.), or any other technology labeled as such by WPS administration, on any assignment, assessment or schoolwork is prohibited. Use of such technology will be treated as plagiarism or cheating and will result in the same disciplinary action as stated in the plagiarism policy.
